Housing 1000: January Update

Our Housing 1000 campaign's goal is to house or prevent imminent homelessness for 1,000 men, women, and children by June 30, 2018. As of December 31, 2017, we are proud to announce that **394** of our formerly homeless neighbors (including 93 veterans) have been placed into housing.

Since 2016, 90% of Interfaith clients placed into housing have successfully remained in their own homes.

Veterans Still a Large Part of Interfaith Programs

In Oceanside, active duty military and veterans have long been a large part of the local community. Interfaith Community Services has been there to support these coastal veterans for many years. Because of the shifting of available veteran program funding by the federal government, Interfaith recently made a strategic move to consolidate our veteran housing programs to strictly our Oceanside facilities. While veteran housing programs have been consolidated, the rest of our wrap-around services continue to be available to veterans throughout North San Diego County,

This shift enables each veteran in Interfaith's housing programs to take advantage of the many additional programs and services available to our nation's heroes. Consolidating the veteran programs offered by Interfaith to the coastal region also offers close proximity to military bases, commissaries and other veteran-serving organizations.

Veterans Programs in Action: Sidney "Big Sid" Matlock Finds Housing with Interfaith

Sidney "Big Sid" Matlock, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran, had informally connected veterans to housing and employment resources at Interfaith for years. However, "Big Sid" never imagined that one day he would be turning to Interfaith to seek help for himself.

After losing his apartment and living out of a storage unit, Big Sid moved into Interfaith's veteran transitional housing program. He lived in an Interfaith apartment for two years while putting his life back together - attending classes, working at Palomar College, coaching football, mentoring students, and volunteering at Interfaith. Today, Big Sid has graduated from Interfaith's transitional housing program and is working while living in his own apartment in Oceanside.
