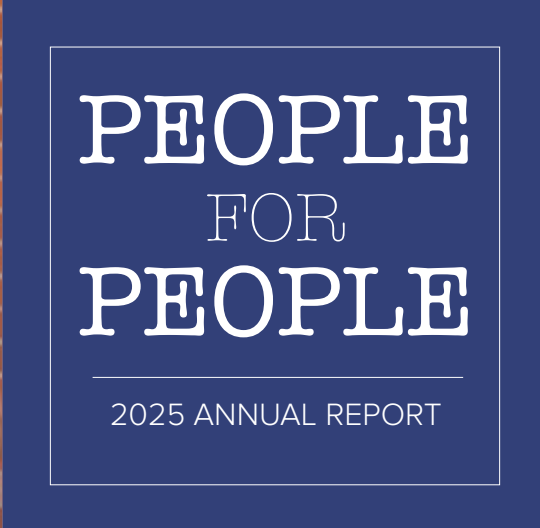

Impact Changes Lives

Through a partnership with the city of Escondido, we expanded our Withdrawal Management program from 11 to 32 beds. As a result, the program helped 393 clients compared to the 269 in FY 23-24. This 46% increase highlights the expansion's powerful impact, especially given the grand opening occurred only four months before the end of the fiscal year.



Detox Grand Opening Tour

Community members and donors were welcomed to an exclusive tour during the grand opening of the Detox Expansion, offering a firsthand look at the enhanced facility and its impact on North County residents.



Painting Positivity

In May 2025, our withdrawal management facility underwent a major renovation with warm, uplifting scenery to boost the residents' spirits so they can focus on their recovery.



Outreach to Uplift

Our Recovery and Wellness Center has a dedicated Homeless Outreach Team who work in the field to connect community members in need with essential sobering services. This year, the team conducted over 290 screenings, leading to 130 individuals being brought off the street and admitted the very same day into our Withdrawal Management Program.

This year, Interfaith introduced a brand-new role-playing event to encourage compassion for the day-to-day challenges low-income community members face. The Empathy Building Experience invites participants to better understand their neighbors by simulating a “month” navigating life in poverty.



Walking in Their Shoes

At the Empathy Building Experience, participants budget for essentials such as rent and utilities to ensure they maintain housing and electricity for the following month.



A Day in the Life

The Empathy Building Experience provides financial literacy support and skills through simulating going to the bank, selling cherished items at the pawn shop, and reaching out to social services for assistance.



Empathy Starts with New Perspectives

After the simulation ends, the participants are given the opportunity to share their thoughts and experiences.

Family is everything

Interfaith is committed to helping families in need secure housing and return to self-sufficiency. In the year since Interfaith was awarded a \$5 million grant by The Bezos Day 1 Families Fund, we have brought 130 families indoors, diverted 79 families from homelessness, and helped 120 families find permanent housing.



Engaging Hearts and Minds

Our Family Shelter provides activities and workshops to entertain and teach the residents. They also boost morale and provide a much-needed break for both children and parents, including this interactive presentation from Radical Reptiles.



Compassionate Care

The Family Shelter staff work hard to provide a safe, comfortable environment for families while providing case management in areas of employment, housing, therapy, and more.

Home at Last

Meet the Linares family. They connected with Interfaith after living out of their car for two years. The father had been injured, resulting in him being unable to work and the family losing their income and housing. They were accepted into our Family Shelter, where they worked hard to regain their self-sufficiency through securing housing and employment.

After being at the shelter for a few months, they were approved and moved into a three-bedroom apartment in North County. Through Interfaith, the Linares family had the security deposit and first month rent covered and received furniture for their new home, therapy for the whole family, and budgeting and housing search assistance.

Kindness on Every Shelf

Our pantry services continue to bring much needed food and supplies to the community. Due to overwhelming demand, we opened the pantry an additional day to better meet the needs of our community.



Celebrating Our VITA Volunteers

Through our Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA), 22 IRS-certified volunteers provide free tax preparation to qualified individuals and families making under \$67,000. This year, our VITA program recovered \$3,853,519 for local taxpayers.



Change Your Mind

The 4th annual Change Your Mind Health & Wellness Festival in Oceanside was a great success thanks to the many volunteers who worked at the event. The community came to support mental health services while enjoying good music and entertainment. This year, we added *Flea by the Sea*, a vintage clothing market to help to raise funds for Interfaith's programs.

The path forward



Sponsor a Senior

In late August 2025, we launched our Sponsor-A-Senior program! This program allows donors to sponsor a senior Interfaith client, covering costs of essentials such as food, hygiene, medication, and more.



Immigration Services

While Immigration Services support is not new, we are focused on deepening our support and commitment through “Know Your Rights” trainings, legal resources, immigration-specific funding assistance, basic needs support, housing, behavioral health, and addiction treatment.



People for People Fund

Interfaith is launching People for People in partnership with Price Philanthropies, a fund created to strengthen services for marginalized communities impact by recent federal policies. This initiative will expand access to basic needs, housing, and flexible direct assistance — especially for immigrant communities and low-income individuals facing federal benefit losses.



Oceanside Navigation Center

In October, Interfaith began operations at the Oceanside Navigation Center. This co-ed shelter functions on a trauma-informed approach, focusing on recovery and dignity. The facility will prioritize Oceanside residents through a direct referral process. Interfaith’s low-barrier, person-centered proposal expands the center from 50 to 75 beds, with an average stay of 2-3 months.



New Interfaith Thrift Store Opening in San Marcos

We will be opening a brand-new thrift store in North City! All profits will support Interfaith programs. This initiative will unite the community for the shared goal of building a brighter future for our North County neighbors.

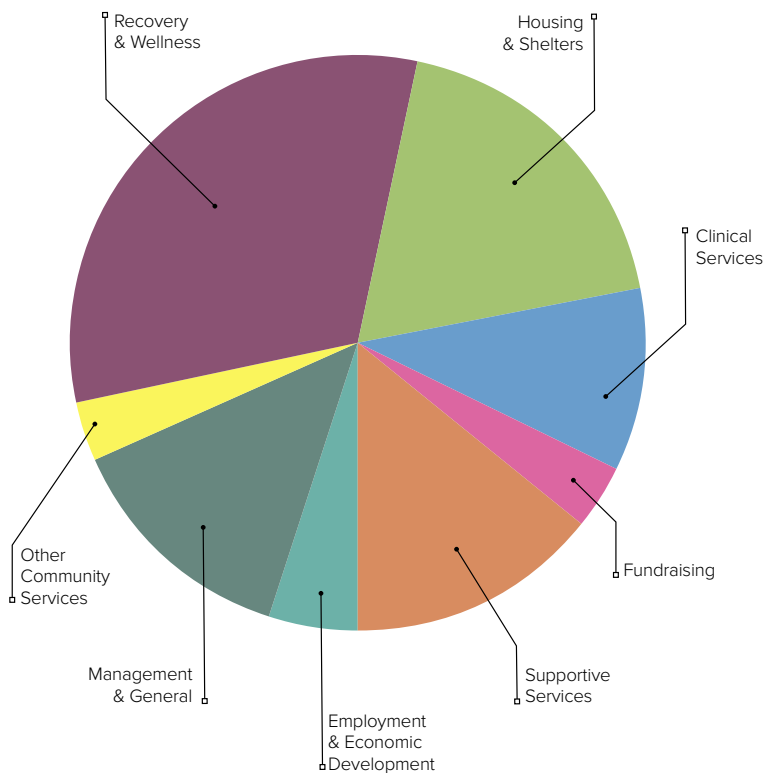
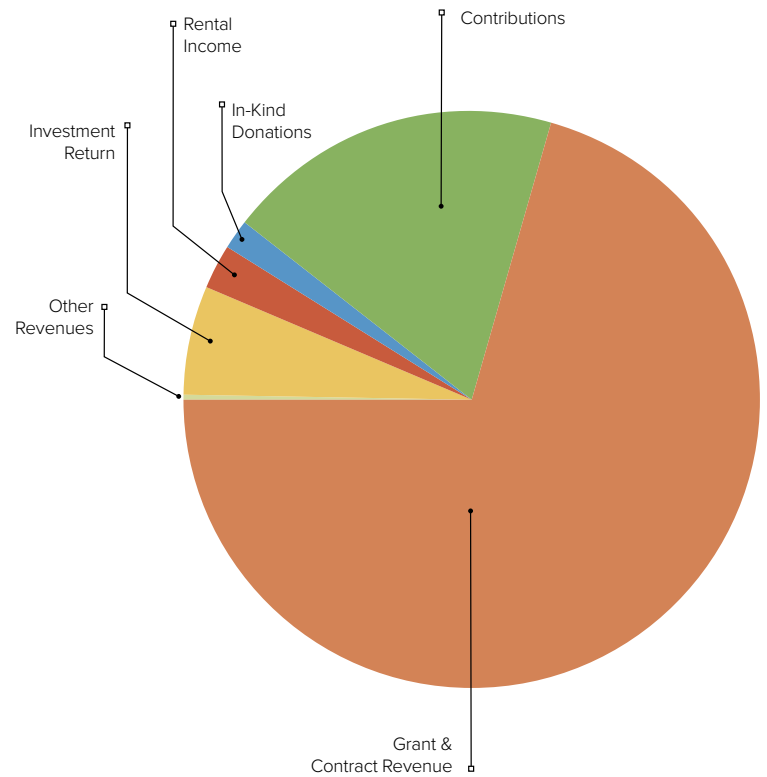
