- Basic Needs

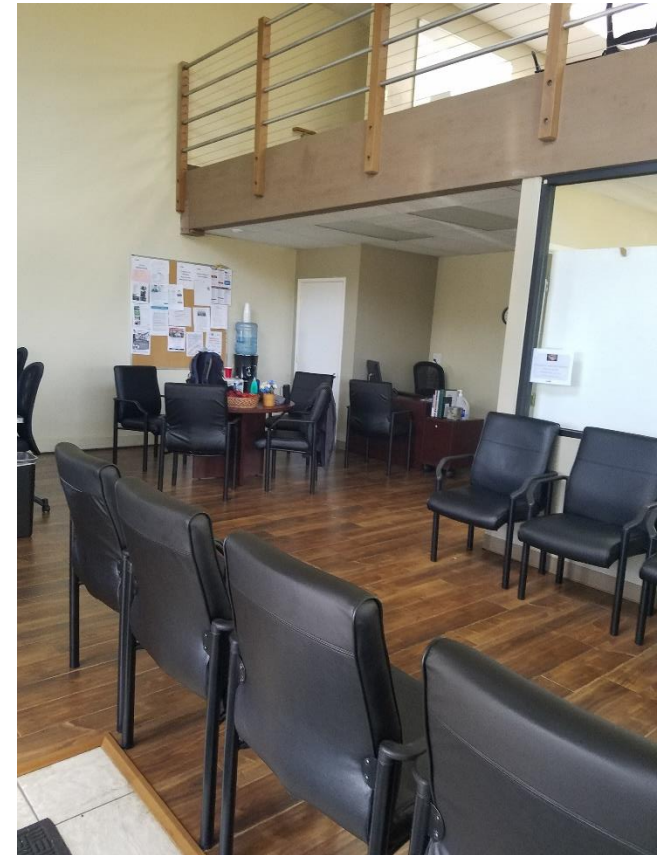
#### Employment Services

- Onsite computer lab for resume development, job search, and resource access
- Case management is available to support clients career development
- Employment supports such as interview attire and sack lunches\*

#### Basic Needs

- 3 days worth of non-perishable food items
- Gas vouchers or bus passes for job interviews and doctor's appointments
- Assistance with identification cards, prescriptions and birth certificates
- Connections to benefits and utility programs
- Additional services available as needed\*

# CSC - DAY LABOR PROGRAM

The day labor program is designed to provide the community with a safe, neutral site whereby employers and workers can negotiate fairly and safely, to meet employment needs. The program does not collect any fees from clients nor the employer.

- **Hours:**
  - Monday-Saturday
  - 7:00 am to 12:00 pm.
    - Clients must arrive at 7:00a.m. to be considered for a day labor assignment.
- **Eligibility:**
  - Basic Health Assessment
  - Proof of Ability to Work in the U.S.
- Assignments are 4 hour minimum at a minimum rate of pay of \$12.50
- General labor and skilled laborers are available for hire; rates of pay are determined based off skill sets requested (Staff negotiates for clients)
- **Transportation assistance and support needed on a daily basis**

# VETERANS EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

## Programs:

1. Homeless Veteran Reintegration Program (HVRP)
2. Homeless Female Veterans and Veterans With Families (HFVWWF)
3. Veterans Employment Related Assistance Program (VEAP)

## Purpose:

To provide services to assist in reintegrating (*homeless*) veterans into meaningful employment within the labor force

## Services Offered:

- Career Development: Job placement, training, job development, career counseling, resume preparation
- Supports: clothing, provision of or referral to temporary, transitional, and permanent housing, referral to medical and substance abuse treatment, and transportation assistance are also provided to meet the needs of this target group.



# TRANSITIONAL YOUTH ACADEMY

## Purpose:

To support youth who are dedicated to improving their academic and career outcomes, and life skills.

## Program objectives include:

- Promote successful completion of GED, High School Diploma, or other academic program
- Promote entering higher education program, trade school, or certificate program
- Increase leadership and civic engagement
- Increase work readiness skills

## Services Provided:

- Academic Support – tutoring, academic motivation, personal individual attention, direct instruction, and error correction
- Intensive Mentoring – youth and case manager relationship development, supplemental enrichment activities to build their academic self-esteem, motivation, and self-efficacy
- After-School Career Development Workshops
- Leadership Lunches\* *Weekly pizza donations needed \**
